

Community Health and Safety FAQs

Q: How will the Community and Creek stay safe during clean-up?

A: All work will be completed in accordance with Federal and State regulations. The demolition company and on site workers will be appropriately trained and certified. During demolition, LaBella Associates shall have a certified person onsite to oversee compliance with applicable regulations.

The site shall be secured with a security fence and excess water produced from site activities will be collected in accordance with procedures outlined in NYS ICR 56.

Q: When will the clean-up be complete?

A: Work is anticipated to be complete by Summer 2024.

Q: How will impacts to the school be minimized?

A: Other than traffic control, we do not anticipate any impacts to the school. To address these concerns, we are developing a plan to divert construction vehicles and related traffic away from the school. Additionally, school arrival and departure schedules (buses & pedestrians) will be considered with respect to project operations.

Q: How will we know what is happening at the site?

A: Press releases will be published periodically to provide the community updates on work being done on site. Another public meeting will be held at the conclusion of the project where a summary of work completed and next steps will be presented.

Q: Where will the discarded materials go?

A: All materials removed will be handled in accordance with current waste handling, transportation and disposal regulations.

Q: How will you ensure that air quality is not negatively impacted?

A: A Community Air Monitoring Plan (CAMP) will be implemented during site work. Air quality monitoring will be conducted for asbestos, dust, and other contaminants. Dust suppression procedures shall be utilized throughout the demolition process as required by regulation.
