FIRE UPDATE

Superintendent of Public Works Kilburn updated the Board regarding the fire that occurred on the evening of Tuesday, October 17, 2017 at the Sullivan Avenue DPW garage. There were two fire investigators at the scene, Steve Miller and Bill Streicher. The cause of the fire is still under investigation. The small bucket truck and two pickup trucks in the building are heavily damaged. While the large bucket truck and the digger derrick were removed they also sustained heavy damage. Per our insurance company we are not allowed to move anything from the building. The Police Department has a man on duty all night at the scene and will do so until the building is secured.

There have been a number of individuals that have reached out and offered support. We have received a bucket truck from Wellsville as well as a bucket truck and digger derrick from Fairport. The Springville electric department is on standby should we need them. Ben Halsley and Nick Titus, both from Pioneer Central School, have offered support. Gernatt's have offered garage space. Apparently Supervisor Bergwanger contacted Senator Gallivan and the Senator has offered his support should we need it for any funding in the way of grants.

The first steps are to inventory the materials, find a garage for the trucks we are borrowing and to consider the options should we need to rebuild the garage. Superintendent of Public Works Kilburn will be meeting with insurance representatives as well as adjusters in the coming days.

The Mayor and the Board recognized the various fire departments for the wonderful job they did in putting the fire out and trying to save the equipment. The Mayor also voiced his appreciation for all of the employees that showed up to the fire to help.
